I wish I could attend all of them, but it is impossible especially since some of the conferences are on the same day. I look forward to seeing as many as I can.

REGION CONFERENCE REGISTRATION:

- To find information about your region conference, look at the Regional Map under "About" tab on the www. tafeonline.org website.
- Region competitive events registrations are linked on the TAFE website. To register:
 - o Login to the website.
 - o Scroll over the Event tab
 - o Click on Region Conferences
 - o Click on the link for your region conference
 - o Follow the instruction on your registration form
- Competitive events registration links will be open on Sunday October 1st. If you do not have your TAFE chapter dues paid, you will not see the Region Conferences page on the Events drop down menu, and you will not be able to register until your chapter dues are paid.

COMPETITIVE EVENTS CHANGES:

- Added a Special Edition category for special needs students with IEP's to help them be successful at their level and added a permission form that needs to be signed to be able to participate in these events.
- Added Goal Setting Contest for Middle School and Special Edition categories
- Added ELF test to Higher Ed events
- Changed Bulletin Board Contest to Interactive Bulletin Board Contest
- Changed sections of Interactive Bulletin Board and Teacher Created Materials to Elementary and Secondary
- Added TEKS required on the summary sheet for Bulletin Board and Teacher Created Materials Contests
- Parliamentary Procedure Guidelines fixed to be consistent throughout to 1 entry per chapter. It had 1 entry in some places on the guidelines and in other places it had 2 entries per chapter.
- · Added a Technology Skills section to the Portfolio Contest Rubric
- Removed Lesson Planning and Delivery Outdoors
- Changed Chapter Scrapbook Contest name to Chapter Yearbook Contest
- Added "NO CELL PHONE use" to all impromptu events
- Added National Activity section to the Student of the Year Leadership Resume'
- Educators Rising dropped Impromptu Lesson this year because they were having a lot of problems with interpretation of the guidelines. We decided to keep it as a state event. One of our teacher leaders, Leah Zavala, was looking it over before using it in her lesson and found a lot of discrepancies and notified us. We cleaned it up and posted the new version mid-September.

SCHOLARSHIPS:

There will be \$100 Judge's Choice scholarship per competition to each participant chosen in the event. For Example: in individual events, the individual receives \$100. In team events, each member of the team will receive \$100.

DRESS CODE CHANGES:

• Change dress code to Skirt/dress and dress shoe – See Dress Code Policy
All students should be in Business Professional dress while competing and attending all TAFE conferences.

Females:

- Dress/Modest Shirt/Blouse with sleeves (Button-up, collared, polo, or shallow neckline is acceptable)
- Dress slacks or skirt/dress (with slits or length or no higher than knee) NO TIGHT fitting clothing
- OPTIONAL sweater or jacket
- Dress Shoes (not athletic or sandals) maximum 3" heel
- No Backless, see through, tight fitting, spaghetti straps, muffs, strapless, low-cut, etc. attire allowed.

EDUCATORS RISING MEMBERSHIP

Educators Rising has changed their dues structure.

Student Membership Tiers:

For 2018-2019, Educators Rising will introduce the EdRising Base and Active Memberships for students.

- Base Membership will be free to all students, and provide them with access to the online Educators Rising Virtual Campus, videos from National Board Certified Teachers, tools to support college planning and job hunting, and much more.
- Active Membership will include all Base Membership benefits plus it allows students to participate in national
 competitions, apply for scholarships, be eligible for recognition via the national Educators Rising Honor Society, and
 serve as national leaders for the entire Educators Rising community. Beginning January 1, 2019, the cost for Active
 Membership will be \$10. Teacher Leader membership will remain free.

NOTE: You do not have to pay anything unless you have students who advance from state to nationals and then you only have to pay for those who advance. As a teacher leader, you do not have to pay. So go ahead and get your students registered on the base membership. After state, those who qualify will have to change their base membership to active and pay the \$10.
