EDUCATORS RISING MICRO-CREDENTIAL ASSESSORS NEEDED Educators Rising, PDK International's pre-collegiate division, is seeking experienced K-12 educators and clinical faculty in teacher preparation programs to serve as micro-credential assessors. The five "Beginning to Teach" micro-credentials were modeled after the edTPA and National Board Certification performance assessments and were developed to showcase the skills and knowledge of aspiring educators and early career teachers. Developed through a partnership with Digital Promise and Bloomboard, the micro-credentials are part of a larger virtual badging ecosystem. The five topics covered are Anti-bias Instruction, Classroom Culture, Collaboration, Formative Assessment, and Learner Engagement.

To apply to be micro-credential assessors, applicants must have taught in a K-12 setting; experience with supervising or mentoring pre-service teachers is preferred. We are also seeking those with calibrated expertise in scoring educational performance assessments and/or in providing effective feedback. All selected applicants will be required to participate in a five-hour training and calibration process. The rate of pay for all assessors is \$60 per hour, with the expectation of scoring at least two submissions per hour.
