Are you an upcoming graduate that has committed to pursuing a postsecondary degree in education? Participate in the 2023 Educators Rising National Signing Day on May 2, 2023! Teacher Leaders should customize the <u>template certificates</u> on their <u>Teacher Leader Resources Page</u> for each student and print them out. Then, students should gather and sign the certificate to celebrate their commitment to the education profession. • EDUCATORS RISING NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

The Educators Rising Honor Society is a distinction that recognizes the academic accomplishments of our student members. This honor serves to elevate the image of teaching by highlighting high-achieving students who are dedicated to a career path in education.

Who qualifies?

- To qualify for the Educators Rising Honor Society students must:
- Be a high school junior or senior
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.50 on a 4.0 scale, including grades from the first semester of the current academic year
- Be an Active-level, national dues-paying member of Educators Rising
- Pay a \$5 application fee

What do I receive?

Those students who are accepted into the Educators Rising Honor Society will receive a personalized certificate of recognition. Those individuals whose schools will allow them to walk with honor cords at graduation may purchase a bulk package for \$20 which includes the application fee/certificate of recognition and honor cords to wear at graduation. Honor cords may also be purchased separately at a cost of \$20 by Honor Society members and Teacher Leaders only. This honor is a résumé-building opportunity for students and a great way for them to receive the recognition they deserve for their academic achievements. Please note juniors may purchase cords as part of their initial induction into the Educator Rising Honor Society. However, they must resubmit and verify eligibility for their senior year in order to wear cords at graduation.

How do I apply?

To apply, simply select the option of recognition that you desire to purchase, login to your membership account and follow the prompts through to checkout. Please note, you will need a copy of your transcripts or report card from this academic year with cumulative GPA listed. The cost to apply is \$5*, or \$20 for the bulk package including honor cords. You must verify your address on your Educators Rising membership account prior to ordering. You will be responsible for any fees incurred with the reshipment of your order if your address is incorrect.

Deadline to apply: May 31, 2023, to be included in the Educators Rising National Conference, students must apply by April 30, 2023
