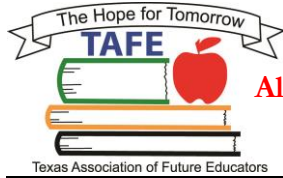

NOTE: The members of the Competitive Events/Service Committee selected TEKS from the Education and Training Career Cluster and the Human Services Career Cluster (specifically child development and child guidance) that they thought were most applicable regardless of the specific project/topics selected for each event. However, depending on the specific projects, other TEKS might also apply.

OBJECTIVE:

To recognize an outstanding, graduating senior for their contributions to the local TAFE chapter

OVERVIEW:

Texas Association of Future Educators will recognize an outstanding graduating senior with a scholarship for his or her contribution to the organization. The amount of the scholarship will be \$1000. Local chapters may nominate two scholarship applicants. One state winner will be recognized with the scholarship and the top ten finalists will be recognized with certificates at the Teach Tomorrow Summit.

COMPETITION GUIDELINES:

- A. **General Competitive Events Guidelines must be followed.**
- B. Student(s) nominated by local chapters must meet the following criteria to be considered:
 - Be a senior.
 - Be an active member with a minimum of two consecutive year's membership in TAFE. If member has transferred from another school, the member must provide certification from both schools regarding TAFE involvement.
 - Have a cumulative grade average of 3.0 for freshman, sophomore and junior years.
 - Complete the official application and attach a transcript and all required attachments and bring to the Teach Tomorrow Summit and submit to judges at check-in.
 - Enroll in an accredited institution of higher education in the summer, fall, or spring following high school graduation.
- C. All complete applications will be interviewed and scored by a team of judges made up of persons from the educational community to include at least one TAFE teacher leader and one TASSP member.
- D. The top five (5) students with the highest scores will be recognized with a certificate on stage at the Teach Tomorrow Summit.
- E. The winner will be recognized at the Teach Tomorrow Summit. Payment of the scholarship will be made upon these guidelines.
 - The winning student must provide proof of college or university enrollment to the TAFE state office with an official registration receipt from the post-secondary school. The recipient must furnish their complete name, as well as the address the check is to be sent.
 - The student awarded the scholarship must utilize the scholarship within the academic year 2019-2020. The scholarship will become null and void upon failure to do so.

COMPETITION FACILITATOR'S AND JUDGE'S INFORMATION:

- A. The judging panel will consist of 1-3 adults. Interview judges will be made up of persons from the educational community to include at least one TAFE Advisor and one TASSP member.
- B. Facilitators will follow the General Instructions for Facilitators.
- C. Judges will follow the General Instructions for Judges.

Important

To compete for TAFE Student of the Year Competition, bring your documents to the Teach Tomorrow Summit and turn it in to the judges at the time of check-in.
